- Has there been a time in your life that you have failed when trying to help others? What did you learn?
- God had a plan to rescue his people from slavery in Egypt. Moses had learned the wisdom of Egypt in the first 40 years of his life. What did he have to learn in the next 40 years of exile that prepared him to lead the people of God out of Egypt?
- After living as a prince in Pharaoh's palace for 40 years, how might God have used 40 years as a shepherd in the wilderness to prepare Moses?
- Have there been times in your life when you needed to wait on God's timing rather than force your own way? How did you know to wait? If you chose not to wait, what happened?
