SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS

- The people of Israel responded to the rules and law of God by saying “all the words that the Lord has spoken we will do.” Within a few weeks they were worshiping an idol and breaking the law of God. The people abandoned their promise to go a different way. What would motivate that kind of unfaithful behavior?
- What causes you in your own life to fail to keep promises or be faithful to something you have committed to?
- Why do you think God said that only Moses was to come close?
- Blood is sprinkled on the people to seal this covenant between God and them. Why sprinkle the people with blood?
- Why was it important for the elders to come into the presence of God after they had received the words of His law?
- What did the leaders of Israel do after they beheld God? This meal in the presence of God serves as a feast to celebrate the covenant between the people and God. How does this experience on the mountain contrast with Jesus eating and drinking with sinners?
- What was the effect of the glory of God on Mt. Sinai? How should we approach God in light of His glory?
