SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS

- What does it mean to receive the grace of God in vain? How should we receive the grace of God in our lives?
- What obstacles prevent people from trusting in God? What obstacles come from believers or the church? How can we eliminate (or minimize) these obstacles?
- What does it mean to commend ourselves in every way? Are there any areas of your life where you are not representing Christ well? Are there any examples of a believer who is representing Christ well?
- Why is it important that our heart and affections are open to embracing the role of being an ambassador? What happens if our hearts are not in it?
- How do we receive teaching, correcting, or instruction from church leaders or Christian mentors? Why is receptivity and humility so essential for Christian ambassadorship?
- Is there anything that particularly stood out to you from the sermon?
