SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS

• Why do you think Peter describes God in v. 17 as one "who judges impartially according to each one's deeds"? What is Peter getting at here?

• Discuss why the concept of being ransomed by Jesus, the perfect Lamb of God, is such an important part of the gospel and our testimony as believers.
