

HOPEFUL LIVING = HOLY LIVING (1 PETER 1:14-16)


SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS

• The apostle Peter could have described his audience in any number of ways in his letter. Why do you think he describes them as "obedient children" in v. 14? In what way(s) should we be obedient children to our Father?

• How does v. 13 (on "preparing our minds for action" and "being sober minded" that Pastor Keith preached about two weeks ago) fit in with this week's message and application?

• Discuss how v. 14 and vv. 15-16 balance each other out in terms of personal responsibility and God's work in and through us in Christ.

• Sermon Question: What does hopeful living look like?
