SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS

- How does Paul receive the news from Titus that the Corinthian church was repenting of their sin? How should this shape our response to someone who is repentant? Why is repentance so important for Christian community?
- What does true repentance look like? What is the difference between godly sorrow and worldly sorrow?
- Paul describes repentance leading to salvation without regret. What does he mean by that statement? What consequences do we need to be reminded of when we are tempted to sin?
- How does Paul teach us to confront sin with affection and hope that someone will repent?
- Is there anything that particularly stood out to you from the sermon?



FAMILY QUESTIONS

- What does it mean to truly repent from sin? If you are sorry for doing something wrong, but you keep doing that wrong thing, are you really repentant?
- If someone is truly sorry and repenting of their sin, how should you respond to them?
